The preparation for the sessions began on Friday, January 12th with Aynsley putting together his new DW drumset that he had just picked up on his way up to Santa Cruz. This meant spending a couple of hours putting on new heads, trying out various drum placements, and tuning up the set. The next day, we started placing microphones and getting the recording session set up before the rest of the musicians arrived.

Once the whole band was ready, we started recording. We started by listening to demos of each song, and then practiced a few times to get in the groove and polish up all the breaks. Once we were

ready, we recorded a few takes of the song and then moved on to the next. We recorded 5 songs that first day. Every song was recorded with the full band playing together, including vocals, which helps to get the right "feel" for the song.

The second day of recording utilized a smaller group, just three-piece: Aynsley, Tom, and Joel. The songs recorded on Sunday were more experimental, so it was easier to work with a smaller group of players. We made it through 2 more songs on Sunday. The 7 songs we recorded form the start of a new album, and we're excited to get working on even more. I think everyone would agree that we were fairly exhausted by the end of this weekend. And just 3 days later, we were heading down to Anaheim to the NAMM show, where we were sure

The Roland booth had an intriguing live demonstration of an electronic accordion, the V-Accordion. The guy playing it showed some amazing capabilities - the wind instrument sounds were quite convincing since they are controlled by the air movement in the accordion body.

On Saturday, we visited the Epiphone/Gibson booth (see article) and checked out some awesome guitars. We also met Twisted Sister guitarist Jay Jay French right before his photo session and interview at the Epiphone booth. We cruised through the piano section and saw some beautiful little toy pianos - actually functional - targeted to very young children. These pianos, made by Schoenhut, really work and look great. 

Israel Kamakawiwo'ole (1959-1997), AKA Bruddah Iz, AKA Izzy is called the Voice of the Hawaiian People. He is most famous for his medley of "Somewhere over the Rainbow" and "Wonderful World". A talented ukelele and guitar player, his powerful but gentle voice continues to capture the hearts of millions worldwide with His widow Marlene passionate renditions of Hawaiian and English songs. He also had an



infectious smile and a quick wit that he used to charm audiences. Unfortunately, in 1998 a lifelong struggle with obesity & an old untreated dog bite finally took his life at the young age of 38.

Though he had exuded a happy friendly persona and had a velvety singing voice, in his younger

days he was also known to have a quick temper and a devastating punch. There is a story that one day on a busy Hawaiian city street, a man pushed a

baby carriage out into the road in order to stop traffic so he could cross. Well, Iz was so outraged that this man would endanger a baby's life in such a way, that he got out of his car and started yelling. When the man continued to show no remorse, Iz threw a single blow, knocking the guy out cold and breaking his jaw. As a 300-plus pound surfer, young Iz was not one to be trifled with.

Les Paul, Epiphone, Gibson, and the Solid-Body Electric Guitar

Les Paul was born Lester Polfus on June 9, 1915, in Waukesha, Wisconsin. He was already a well known guitarist when he designed his first solid-body electric guitar in 1941, at facilities borrowed from the Epiphone guitar company in New York. The experimental instrument, which later came to be known as "The Log", was built by cutting an old Epiphone archtop guitar in half, and reassembling it with a slab of solid pine down the center (hence, the "log"). Paul mounted homemade pickups on the block of wood, and completed the guitar with an old Gibson neck and fingerboard. Despite its advantages in feedback suppression and high sustain, he was unsuccessful in getting anyone to manufacture it. But 10 years later, in 1951, Gibson realized it needed to compete with Leo Fender, who had already mass-produced the Fender

Broadcaster beginning in 1948. After approaching Les Paul in 1951 with a Gibson prototype, it took another year to ready the Les Paul Standard guitar for production in 1952, but Leo Fender had a four year jump, thus beating Paul to popular credit for the invention. Nonetheless, the Les Paul acquired a devoted following, and its versatility and balance made it the favored instrument of such figures as Jimmy Page and Peter Frampton.

The Epiphone guitar company has a history that goes back over 100 years. Started in 1903 by Greek immigrant Anastasios Stathopoulo and originally manufactured under the label "A. Stathopoulo", Epiphone instruments grew to be among the most highly prized and respected in the world. Anastasios' son, Epi, took control of the business after the death of his father in 1915. He later changed the name to "Epiphone" as an amalgamation of his own nickname and a derivation of the Greek word for 'sound'. Throughout the 1930's, Epiphone and Gibson engaged in a rivalry that veered from friendly sparring to all-out warfare, with each company introducing guitars to out-do the other. Gibson had a bigger guitar, so Epiphone made its line bigger too. Gibson responded with an even bigger model, and so on.

During World War II, while U.S. guitar production was shut down, Epi tragically died of leukemia, leaving his younger brothers Orphie and Frixo in control of Epiphone. Unfortunately, they did not get along, and Frixo left the company. And Epiphone began to lose its reputation for craftsmanship and quality. Faced with additional competition from Fender and shrinking market share, Orphie decided to sell the company to Gibson for \$20,000, and the deal was finalized in May of 1957.

Strange, isn't it, how Les Paul invented the solid-body guitar at Epiphone, but marketed it at Gibson, who eventually bought Epiphone, and competed with Fender who took popular credit for Les Paul's invention by being first to market?

At 91 years old, Les Paul still performs every Monday night at the Iridium Jazz Club in New York City.


